For every pint of dessert stout, 10% or higher, you consume on Saturday, you may deduct one stroke from your final score on Sunday

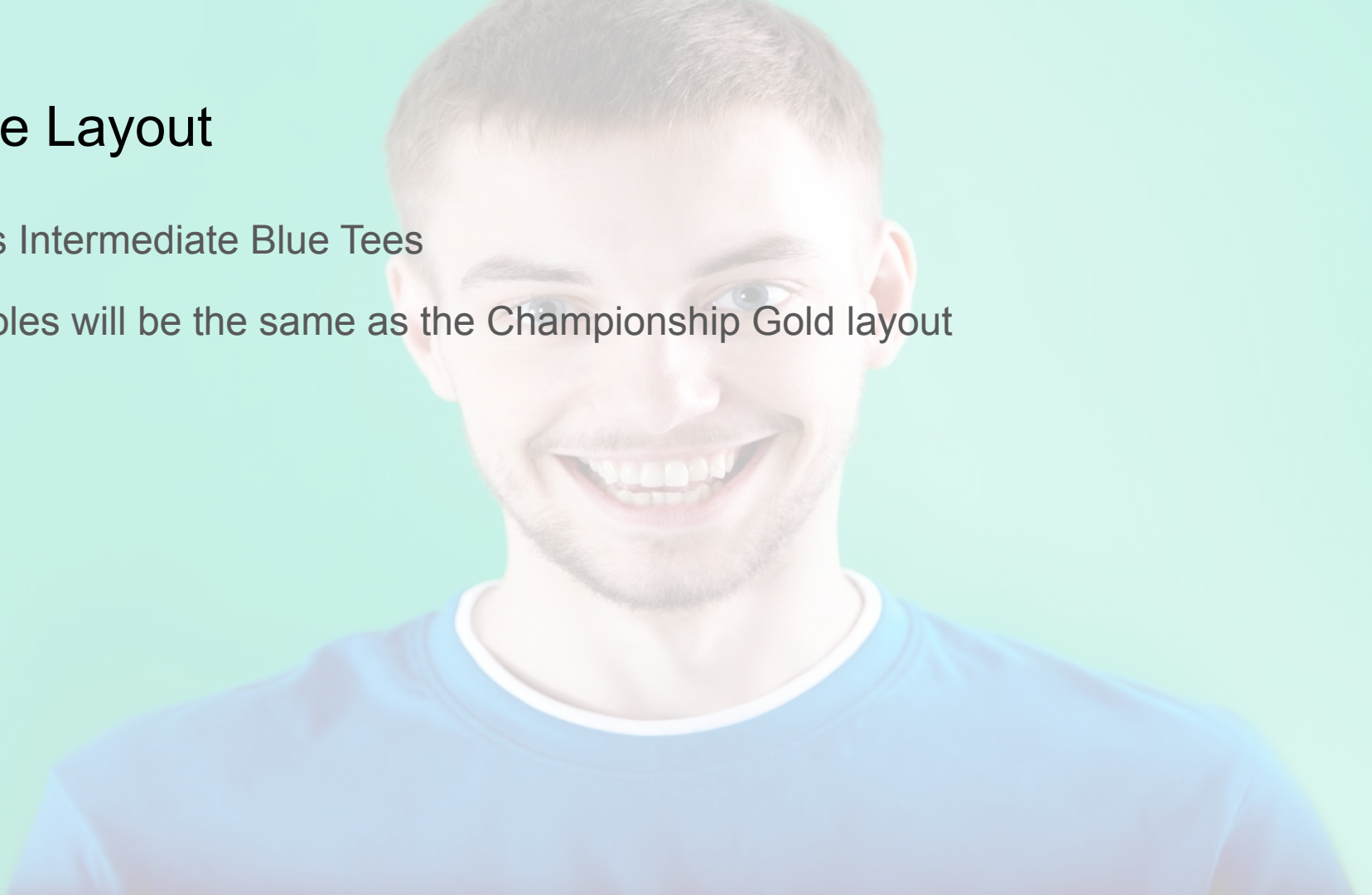
For every pint of sour you consume, you may choose the disc a player uses for one shot

Course Layout

18 Holes Intermediate Blue Tees

Some holes will be the same as the Championship Gold layout



Hole 1

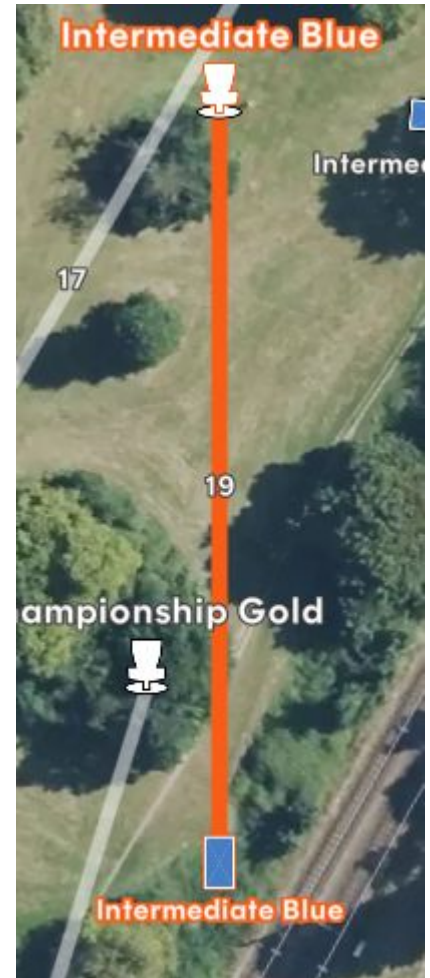
Starting off with a tough and tight par 3 through a narrow gap. Good thing you get two off the first. Although, being honest, it probably won't help. This is a tough hole to start



Hole 2

Easy hole. I've Aced it. If you don't, you're bad.

Par 3 (some people need the extra two shots, smh).



Hole 3

Troublesome par 3. Mando between tree 2, and the other one. If you're still evens or under, you're doing great.



Hole 4

Par 3. There may or may not be a Mando to the right of the First tree. I can't remember. I can't remember anything. Please God, help me.



Hole 5

This is where it all falls apart. There is a Mando, but don't worry, you will be in the bushes far before your disc even crests the hill. Par 3 btw.



Hole 6

A straightforward par 3. However, treat this hole with respect because it can still suck you off soft and hit you with a double bogey if you're not careful.



Hole 7

Ahh yes. Hole 7. A long flexing forehand, or a backhand over the hedge? Doesn't matter, you will be OB and taking a bogey from the drop zone. Par 3.



Hole 8

Looking to pick up an extra two strokes at minimum? Good. Hole 8 has you covered with this par 4. Mando to the left of Tree 9, up the hill, and to your death.



Hole 9

Halfway. Are you tilted yet? How's your score look?

Disappointing, I know. Well, try this par 3 on for size. Hit the gap with a flexi forehand or a slow turn backhand if you can. If there's a park run on, you will see violence on a scale never before documented.

Are your cheeks feeling raw? Well, here's an uphill forehand Par 3 you can attempt. Don't go in the bushes.



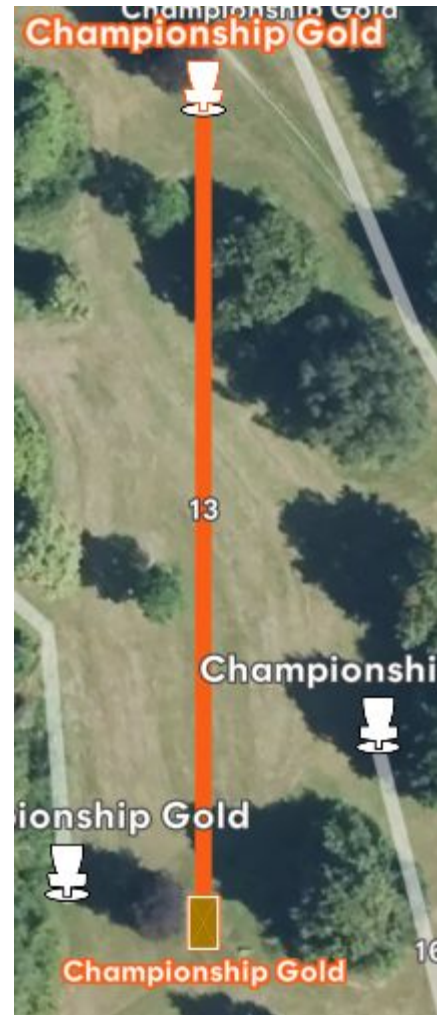
Hole 11

Let's all take a rest in the shade of the trees. We'll all be looking for discs in there anyway. Paer 3



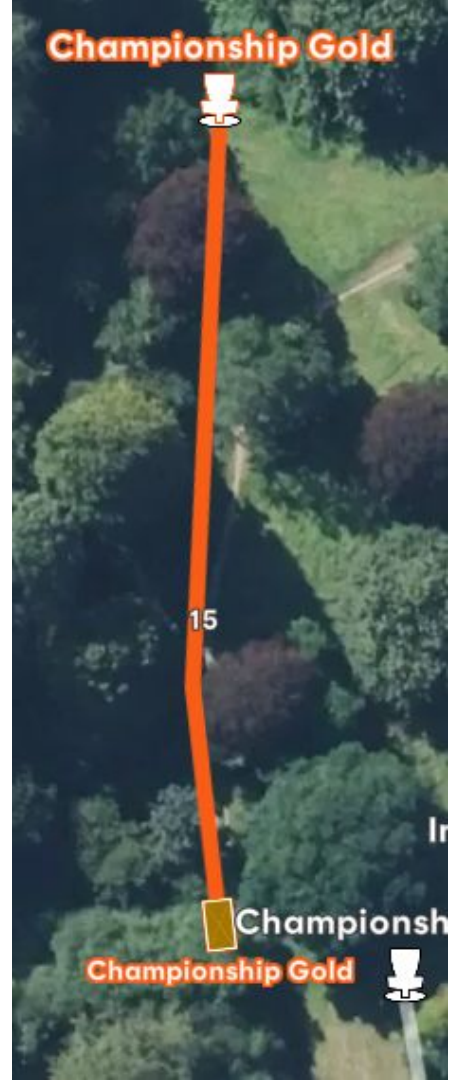
Hole 13

I don't care about anything.



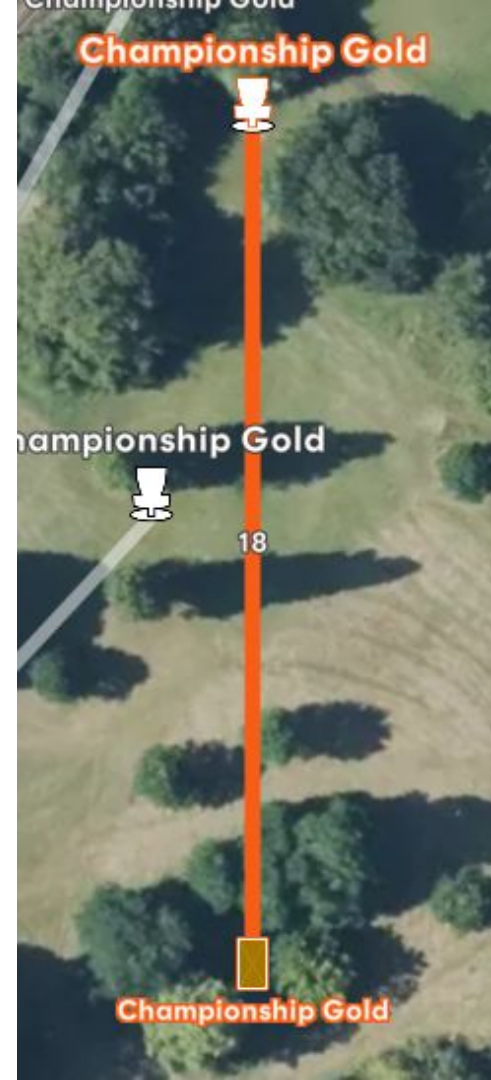
Hole 17
