

Twin Tiers Disc Golf League Rules and Code of Conduct

Mission Statement

Our mission is to create safe, fair, and welcoming competitive spaces for people of all abilities. We strive to foster an environment where new players, recreational players, and experienced competitors alike can enjoy the game in a spirit of sportsmanship and mutual respect. Competition should be conducted with honesty, integrity, and consideration for fellow players, spectators, volunteers, and host communities. Winning is valued, but preserving trust, safety, and the enjoyment of the game for everyone is paramount.

Governing Rules

Except where specifically modified by these league rules, all league rounds shall be played according to the current PDGA Official Rules of Disc Golf and Competition Manual.

Players are expected to familiarize themselves with the current rules and uphold the spirit of the game.

Scorekeeping Procedures

- Scores should be verbally confirmed after every hole.
- Players are encouraged to review scores before submission.
- Players are responsible for ensuring their own score is correct.
- Intentional score manipulation will not be tolerated.

Reporting Misconduct

Players are encouraged to promptly report misconduct, unsafe behavior, cheating, harassment, or other concerns to league officials. Reports may be made in person or through any reasonable means of communication. League officials will review concerns fairly and may speak with players, witnesses, or other individuals as necessary. All reports will be handled as discreetly as practical, though complete confidentiality cannot be guaranteed. Players are encouraged to raise concerns in good faith and are expected to do so honestly and respectfully.

Violations and League Actions

Intentional misreporting of score	Disqualification
Manipulating another player's score	Disqualification
Collusion to alter scores	Suspension review
Falsifying ace pot or CTP results	Loss of winnings and DQ
Cheating affecting payouts	Suspension review
Repeated cheating	Permanent expulsion
Unsportsmanlike conduct	Warning
Abusive language	Warning or DQ
Harassment or intimidation	Immediate removal
Threatening language	Immediate removal
Physical violence	Permanent expulsion
Property damage	Suspension review
Reckless throwing	Immediate removal
Extreme intoxication	Removal from event
Ignoring TD instructions	Warning or DQ
Deliberate slow play	Courtesy violation
Fraud involving league funds	Permanent expulsion
Theft	Permanent expulsion

Protection from Retaliation

No player shall be subject to retaliation for making a good-faith report of misconduct, safety concerns, or suspected rules violations. Retaliation includes intimidation, threats, harassment, false accusations, exclusion, or other actions intended to discourage players from reporting concerns. Any player found engaging in retaliation may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including suspension or expulsion from league activities.

Discipline and Appeals

League officials may consider the severity of the violation, intent of the player, prior history, effects on other participants, and safety concerns. League officials reserve the right to impose stronger penalties when circumstances warrant. Any player subject to disqualification, suspension, or expulsion may request a review by league leadership. The purpose of these rules is not punishment, but the protection of a fair, enjoyable, and welcoming environment for all participants.
